CHANGE IN MASS PRAYER

Since Ash Wednesday, you have probably noticed that I no longer include the word "one" before the word "God" at the end of the Collect (Opening Prayer) of the Mass. Here is why: In May of 2020, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments clarified the proper and correct translation from Latin into English of the concluding "doxology" of the Collects found in the Roman Missal (the large "prayerbook" which contains the prayers of the Mass). The Congregation noted that the current translation is incorrect based on the original Latin text. There is no mention of "one" in the Latin and "Deus" in the Latin text refers to Christ. Therefore, the correct translation is simply "in the unity of the Holy Spirit, **God**, forever and ever." The word "one" never appears in the Latin text of the prayer, but was added in the English translation after the Second Vatican Council's reform of the Liturgy. Words, especially the words of our prayers, are important! The words of our prayers reflect what we believe. I should have mentioned this earlier, but it was my hope and plan that it would be printed in "The Mirror" so that everyone throughout the Diocese would understand and know the reason for the change. I hope this answers any questions you may have! Father David

Please be reminded that it is the hope and expectation that a person is attending Mass regularly at St. Henry if he/she wishes to celebrate and receive a Sacrament in our parish. There are a few exceptions: if parents wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry but live in another community OR an engaged couple who wish to celebrate their marriage at St. Henry but again live in another community. For those who are "parishioners" of St. Henry and wish to have their child baptized here or receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation at St. Henry, or to celebrate your marriage here, you need to be attending Mass regularly at St. Henry Parish. Attending Mass is a necessary and essential part of our Catholic Faith and spiritual life as well as a requirement to receive the Sacraments of the Church.
